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

(including depreciation) in 2004–05






The Chancellor's fiscal rules

- Golden rule: only borrow to invest
 - Receipts cover current spending
 - Surplus or balance on current budget
 - Judged over the economic cycle
- Sustainable investment rule: debt at a 'stable and prudent' level, <40% of national income




Current budget surpluses












































Cyclically adjusted current budget surplus, as a share of national income


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
