The London Young People Study (LYPS)



The London Young People Study is the research study that evaluates the impact of *Your Choice* across London

- Your Choice provides training in CBT techniques to youth practitioners working with young people aged 11-18 at elevated risk of contextual harm
- This study aims to understand whether Your Choice helps to improve young people's outcomes relative to Business As Usual support

Progress made so far

Pilot trial



- Summer 2022 to March 2023
- Small-scale, in all 32 LAs
- Aimed at assessing feasibility of evaluation
- Learn about barriers to implementation
- Pilot data collection

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Review and transition period

- Review
 experience of
 pilot trial to
 assess whether
 large-scale
 evaluation is
 possible
- Improvement of processes in view of largescale trial

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Efficacy trial

- August 2023 December 2024
- Larger-scale, in all LAs
- Aimed at detecting impacts on young people's outcomes with confidence

How can we evaluate the impact of *Your Choice*?

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To evaluate the impact of *Your Choice*, we need to compare the outcomes of **two groups of young people** with each other

Treated Group

Young people who receive **Your Choice**

Control Group

Young people who receive **Business As Usual** support

- → We need data on both groups
- → Both groups need to be as similar to each other as possible when entering the study






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
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


How is the trial designed?





Randomisation of teams + Natural allocation mechanism of CYP to teams = Robust evaluation



Safeguarding



2 safeguarding processes to be aware of:

1. YEF must be informed of a safeguarding incident within 48 hours

- In serious cases involving rape, homicide, attempted murder
- When safeguarding allegation is made against staff member funded by the Project
- Where safeguarding incident happens during/on the premises of an activity in the project
- To report this incident, the practitioner must complete the <u>Safeguarding Reporting Incident form</u>

2. Local Authorities will be notified of any safeguarding concerns

- Safeguarding notifications will be triggered if a young person indicates to be at risk/pose a risk when completing the questionnaires
- Important that the young person is given the opportunity to speak with a trusted worker
